2025 GENERAL SERVICE CONFERENCE

Each April, about 135 people (the 93 Area Delegates of the US and Canada, 21 Trustees, 6 Non-Trustee Directors and 15 staff of GSO) meet to conduct the General Service Conference of Alcoholics Anonymous. This is “the time the collective group conscience of the US/Canada A.A comes together to take actions that will guide the groups in the years that follow.” (AA Service Manual, pg.39)

Our Delegate represents the California Northern Coastal Area 06 (CNCA06) which has over 60,000 members in over 2,000 groups. Each Group’s conscience and vote is delivered to our Delegate by a General Service Representative (GSR), ... *but groups without GSRs do not have a voice at the Conference.*

Before our Delegate heads to the 2025 Conference, she wants to be informed of the Groups’ Consciences. These are just a few examples of the topics to be discussed this year:

- *Restricting future changes to the Founders’ writings.*
- *Including the 12 Concepts essays in the next edition of the “12 Steps and 12 Traditions”.*
- *Changing the limits on annual contributions and bequests.*
- *Updating several pamphlets and the book “Living Sober” for the first time in 50 years*
- *Removing the word “woman” in the Concept IV essay (C-13)*

Sales Tax is now Included in VSC Purchases

Whenever the Valley Service Center (VSC) buys books, pamphlets, chips or other items, Sales Tax and Shipping are added to our purchases by the seller.

Individuals who purchase direct from AAWS or any other source, also pay this same tax, - *plus shipping*.

Beginning in March, we began adding the required Sales Tax of 10.25% to purchases.

Purchases at the VSC will still avoid shipping costs.

For the past few years, the VSC has absorbed the cost of Sales Tax, paying a substantial amount at the end of each fiscal year based on our sales. However, in the Spirit of the Tradition of Self-Support, we can all pitch in now to meet this unavoidable and legally required responsibility..

4th Quarter Report from the General Service Office (GSO)

(Excerpts)

One of the two presenters in the Fall Quarterly Sharing Session was our own Past-Delegate and current Non-Trustee Director of the Grapevine, Teddy B-W.

Here a few excerpts from his talk.

He quoted a 1946 Grapevine article in which Bill W. said, "Nobody invented Alcoholics Anonymous. It grew."

Teddy said, "The application of the Traditions continues to evolve. A group conscience is rarely a final decision or irrevocable vote. It is more like a consensus with substantial unanimity. For me, as an alcoholic it is essential that I learn to let go, to compromise and work in harmony with others."

"The process of group decisions involves ... importantly listening as if we have no opinion. ... In this way, deep listening is an act of surrender. How many times have I heard myself say 'I think we need a group conscience on this,' when what I meant was 'I'm upset about this, and everyone needs to agree with me.'"

"It is my solemn duty to do all that I can to cultivate the climate in which the minority opinion can reveal itself."

"To participate in the group conscience process requires me to believe that no one of us knows better than all of us. That makes it possible for me to put the "we" before the "me" and play my part in helping the group reach an informed group conscience."

The Group Inventory - a Sharing Session

Some groups of our Groups conducting a Group Inventory.

In the pamphlet "The A.A. Group—Where it all Begins" (P-16), on pages 29-30, there are 13 questions which can help get things started. Some Groups may develop their own questions. Either way, it is almost always a help to pause and ask ourselves, "How are we doing?"

It is recommended that the inventory be facilitated by someone from outside the Group who also brings an unaffiliated person, (a scribe) to record the Group's comments (anonymously).

inventories are frequently done using the Sharing Session model. A facilitator poses each question and then, going around the room, everyone who wants to gets a chance to chime in. The Group may use a timer to keep responses brief, often 2 or 3 minutes. This may be repeated until all have been heard.

It is suggested that the number of questions for the Group be kept down to a reasonable number so that there is time to consider each carefully.


